#### ABOUT HOSPICE AFRICA UGANDA (HAU),

- Hospice Africa Uganda (HAU) was founded in 1993 in Kampala
- HAU expanded to include two additional sites in 1998: Mobile Hospice Mbarara (MHM) in January and Little Hospice Hoima (LHH) in June.
- Palliative care as provided by HAU is a philosophy, not a building; we bring modern methods of pain and
- symptom control, counselling and spiritual support to patients and families.
- HAU served 2189 patients in the most recent fiscal year, and has seen over 31,364 patients in all.
- We do not have inpatient care, but serve patients at our sites and through several outreach sites and home visits for those unable to travel to our offices.
- The majority of our patients are at home in their communities, where they wish to spend their final days with their families and close to their ancestors. Why African palliative care?

#### Why African Palliative Care?

1. Cancer and NCDs are on the increase as African life expectancy increases.

2. Fewer than 5% of cancer patients in Africa today have access to oncology services and/or surgery.

3. 30% of African countries lack even one radiotherapy machine. The one in Uganda is no longer functioning and has yet to be replaced.

4. 57% of all Ugandans never see a health worker and 95% of cancer patients remain in the community, without specialized treatment.

5. In Uganda today, 250,000 are estimated to be in need of palliative care.

6. In Africa 20 countries still have not heard of palliative care; the suffering continues.


The vision for Hospice Africa is "Palliative care for all in need in Africa"

#### .Where Do Our Patients Come From?

- Most are referred from their home communities by HAUtrained Community Volunteers
- Some are "self-referred" they have witnessed the palliative care provided to their friends and neighbors in their communities and/or patients refer others in need
- Other patients are referred by hospitals or the health centres where HAU does outreach

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#### Cost and contributions:

- Cost per week is 86,200/- per patient
- The total cost includes transport and a specially trained team.
- Patients are requested to contribute 10,000/- towards the cost
- One third of our patients can manage to pay this small contribution.
- No patient is refused assessment and treatments.
- We assist those who cannot afford (60% of our patients).

- Palliative care is now available in 90% of the Districts in Uganda.
- This enables ever more patients to be treated in their home communities.
- However, the need still far outstrips treatment capacity; we have a long way to go!

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#### **IHPCA Teaching Programmes**

- Over 10,000 health and related professionals have been trained in palliative care since 1993.
- 63 students from 11 countries graduated with Diplomas and Bachelors degrees in 2017.
- Anglophone and Francophone countries receive advocacy and training from IHPCA at their request.
- IHPCA launched 4 new programs in 2017: M.Sc. in Palliative Care, Postgraduate Diploma in Clinical Palliative Care, Pediatric Care and Psychosocial and Spiritual Palliative Care.
